

Minutes
March 2, 2010

The Cedar Creek Board of Trustees met in regular session at 7:00 p.m., on 3-02-10, at the Village Hall. Board members present: Muntz, Olson, McAllister. Moses arrived at 7:05 p.m. Winkler was absent. Advance notice of the meeting was given by posting in the village and by publication in the Plattsmouth Journal. The notice stated, said meeting shall be open to the public, the agenda is available for public inspection at the Village Hall, and the agenda is not to be enlarged later than twenty four hours prior to the scheduled meeting except for items of an emergency nature.

Motion by Olson, second by McAllister, to approve the 2-02-10 minutes as written and as published. All ayes.

Motion by Olson, second by McAllister, to approve the treasurer's report and pay all claims. All ayes.

Police Report:

As reported by the Cass County Sheriff's Department, 67.88 hours of patrol were logged for Cedar Creek during the month of February. There were two calls for service: Special Services & Warrant Service. Three warnings were issued for traffic violations.

Correspondence:

Information from the League of Nebraska Municipalities on LB868, a bill to change workers compensation provisions for community service workers.

Information received from Keep America Beautiful on the annual Great American Cleanup, March 1 through May 31, 2010 and the annual Nebraska Trash Off, April 17 – 24, 2010. C. Paukert stated a Spur cleanup may be scheduled to correspond with the events.

Reports of Officers, Boards, Committees:

C. Paukert, Village Floodplain Manager, reported on the ongoing construction at Lot #207, 1008 Platteview Drive. Paukert stated the construction will continue to be monitored to assure the project complies with all regulations.

Unfinished Business:

It was reported, all scheduled improvements to the office and meeting room have been completed.

JEO Drainage Project. No new information has been received. Dan Fricke of JEO stated NDOR is to have a project design ready by the May 2010 meeting to present to the Board.

Riverbank Stabilization Project. Chair Muntz signed a letter to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers requesting financial assistance under the Section 14 program, emergency stream bank erosion protection.

Miscellaneous Business:

Village Attorney, A. Minahan, reported on the court case of Village of Cedar Creek vs. B. Bohuslavsky, regarding nuisance violations at 4028 Lakeview Drive, 100 East B Street, 101 East B Street, and 207 East B Street, all in Cedar Creek. An inspection report was received from Jim Rughe, Cass County Zoning Administrator, on structures he inspected at 101 East B and 207 East B. A. Minahan will enter a file for readiness for trial with the District Court. A date will be set for trial of the case.

New Business:

Dan Williams of Wild Willy Fireworks requested permission from the Board to sell fireworks in Cedar Creek for 2010. Discussion was held on location, regulations, donation to the Fire Department. Williams will return with detailed plans at a later date.

A complaint was received on dogs running at large. Notice of the existing leash law will be posted.

The Cass County Recycling Program begins this week. Cedar Creek will have a recycling trailer on the south side of the Fire Barn at 200 East B Street, Monday through Friday, every three weeks. Schedules are posted, are available at the village office, are at www.cedarcreeknebraska.com, and at the Post Office. Recycling boxes, for home use, are available at the village hall for a cost of \$1.00 each. A list of what is allowed will be attached to the trailer. Cardboard is to be deposited in the designated slot, other recyclables need not be sorted. Cass County used grant funds to purchase the trailers and support the program.

Jeff Baulish will begin filling pot holes this week.

Motion by McAllister, second by Olson, to allow \$400.00 for the Easter Egg Hunt. All ayes. Trish Moses is to organize the event.

A resident in attendance questioned if someone could paint the old store because it is such an eyesore. Chair Muntz informed him, it was privately owned and is in court for not being maintained.

There being no further business to come before the board, motion by Moses, second by Olson, to adjourn. All ayes.
